Procedure(s)

TRACH AND PEG PLACEMENT
 CT CHEST/A/P - Impression:
 1. Diffuse bilateral and multifocal mass-like areas of consolidation. This may relate to atypical infection, perhaps eosinophilic pneumonia. The possibility further pathology such as septic embolic source or additional etiologies such as Wegener's granulomatosis should be included in the differential. There are shotty to enlarged lymph nodes within the mediastinum and hilar structures. Recommend bronchoscopic evaluation.
 2. Fatty infiltration of the liver.
 RENAL U/S - Impression:
 Somewhat limited study due to the patient's body habitus but no hydronephrosis noted.

DISCHARGE SUMMARY

DISCHARGE DIAGNOSES

1. Respiratory failure.
2. Legionella pneumonia.
3. Acute renal failure.
4. History of diabetes, hypertension, and neuropathy.

PROCEDURES

CT of the chest, diffuse bilateral multifocal mass-like areas of consolidation. Renal ultrasound somewhat limited but no hydronephrosis. Multiple chest x-rays. Hemodialysis. Tracheostomy and PEG placement.

CONSULTATIONS

Pulmonary, infectious disease, cardiology, nephrology, surgery, and psychiatry.

HISTORY OF PRESENT ILLNESS AND HOSPITAL COURSE

Please refer to the discharge summary done by Dr. Peter Foss and history and physical done by him for further details. The majority of the hospital course was covered in the discharge summary dictated by Peter Foss. Essentially the patient fired Dr. Foss and the patient was transferred to our service. The patient was being evaluated for possible placement in a rehabilitation facility but the patient did not want to go to a rehabilitation facility. The patient made arrangements to have one of her friends who was a former PT to come and live with her for the next two weeks. Physical therapy/occupational therapy was okay with that as long as the patient had 24-hour supervision. I personally talked to this friend who was present by the patient's bedside and she stated that she would be able to adequately take care of the patient and provide appropriate physical therapy/occupational therapy and any assistance that the patient needed for the next 2-3 weeks. The patient did not have any other further complaints of seeing that most of her acute issues had resolved it was felt that the patient could probably be discharged home with home health care and 24-hour supervision from her friend.

DISCHARGE MEDICATIONS

1. Amaryl 4 mg two tablets daily.
2. Avandamet 2/100 two pills daily.
3. Effexor 75 mg daily.
4. Ferrous sulfate 325 mg every 8 hours.
